




Telling the time to 5 minutes





Causal Conjunctions Card Game

Instructions

Separate the two sets of cards into two piles and place them face down on the table.

- 1. Causal conjunctions (purple)
- 2. Clause (orange)

Take it in turns to take one card from each pile and construct a sentence using a causal conjunction, a clause and then any other clause/phrase/punctuation that you may need.

e.g. Everyone likes the new teacher as a result of his funny jokes.
