Learning Overview for week ending 28th April

Literacy

- Introduced digraphs ea, ow and trigraph ure.
- Independently practised cursive letter formation for graphemes learnt so far, with a focus on the digraphs, ai, ar.
- Introduced phase 4 words said, so, went, from, saw, come, some, help, like, have.
- Practised blending and segmenting adjacent consonant clusters, (two phonemes that blend together) e.g. s-t-em. t-r-ow-el.
- Introduced and sequenced events to the book Jaspers Beanstalk.
- Created our own Jasper Beanstalk maps using key events and then using these to retell our own stories.
- Refreshed knowledge of sequencing language, first, then, next, after that, finally and used when retelling our stories.
- Practised writing a sentence, using capital letters, finger spaces and a full stop.

Maths

- Counted on to 40 and back in ones from 15, then 20. Counting in 2s to 10.
- Subitising objects to 6.
- Used our fingers to show different ways to make 7.
- Discovered addition and subtraction facts for 7 using, Numicon and dominoes.
- Introduced the concept of time using first, next, last and sequenced events such as breakfast, sleeping, brushing teeth into these concepts.
- We then looked at activities we do in the morning, afternoon and at night time, and ordered these.
- Learnt about the days of the week.







IMPORTANT MESSAGES

- Use all phonics flashcards to make ccvc words for your child to read.
- Practise reading words in the wallet by sight. How fast can you say them? Can you beat your score?
- Play spot the digraph/ trigraph (ea, ow, ear, ure and air) in books, magazines, on posters around the house and when out and about.
- Ask your child to re-tell you the story of Jaspers Beanstalk, they could even have go at drawing a story map and writing a sentence to say what happened.
- Have a go at rocket rescue (phase 3) on Phonics play. Go to
