

Thank you to all the parents who are entering the playground with their children.

Included again incase you missed it.

We no longer need children to be dropped at the gate in the mornings. Just like other primary schools, we can now invite families onto the playground. The increasing number of adults standing at the gate in the mornings has become dangerous and due to our duty to safeguard our children we must insist that all children are accompanied by an adult onto the playground at drop off.

Pick up runs really smoothly when all adults enter the playground. From now on, we ask that you walk your child across the playground to their classroom or to the far corner where a member of staff will guide them round to the KS2 classrooms. Year 5 and Year 6 are still able to walk to and from school unaccompanied.



The parking outside of school has become problematic. Please ensure that you do not block people's driveways or park on the raised speedbump by the front gates. Where ever possible we ask that families avoid driving to school. If you have to drive, please park considerably and if possible, by the shops and walk up to school.

We ask that families avoid parking in the staff car park at drop off and collection. Parking in the staff car park can mean that there are not enough spaces for staff and also the car park can be very busy with moving vehicles at drop off and pick up times making it dangerous for children.

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
