Safeguarding spotlight

How can I help my child have a safer digital Christmas?

A message from Karl Hopwood (Independent online safety expert): many of us will give or receive gifts which are "connected" for Christmas this year. From a digital camera that immediately streams to YouTube, TikTok or Instagram, to the latest smartphone, online game or Oculus headset, a lot of us will spend time on Christmas day figuring out how to get our latest gadget online and connected to the world wide web. And perhaps that's the way it should be, over these past few difficult years technology has indeed provided us with a lifeline – a way to keep in touch with family and friends as well as to keep learning and running our businesses and going to work. There are a few simple tips that can be helpful when using tech and trying to get a good balance over the festive period.





It's a good idea to agree on some tech-free times for everyone (adults included!) mealtimes are a good place to start. Equally, not having technology in the bedroom overnight is a good strategy and will help to ensure that everyone has a better nights sleep without the distraction of a device that is constantly pinging with group messages and notifications throughout the night. Take some time to look into the tools that are available on smartphones, tablets and other devices and ideally set up parental controls by agreeing with your child on what is a sensible approach to content that they can access and time that they can spend.
