

Pendragon Primary School Pupil Premium Report 2013-14

Overview	<p>The Pupil Premium is designed to ensure that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The funding is allocated to Local Authorities and schools with pupils from Reception to Year 11 who are eligible for free school meals( FSM) are looked after or have parents currently in the Armed Forces. From April 2012, the coverage of the Premium was widened to include those eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years(these children are identified as Ever 6).This money is ring fenced for those children.</p> <p>The amount per pupil for the academic year 2013-14.£900</p>

The effect of the expenditure on the education attainment of those pupils who were eligible for pupil premium in the academic year 2013-14	<p>Impact</p> <p>Only one child in Foundation stage was in receipt of Pupil premium.</p> <p>The impact on the progress of children from Year 1 to Year 6 was that the average points progress was:</p> <p>Reading 4.5 Writing 4.2 Maths 4.3</p> <p>Overall 75% of children made 3 or more points progress( where 6 points is equal to a level progress). 62% children made 3.5+points progress in the year.</p> <p>52% of children in receipt of Pupil premium were also identified with additional special needs.</p>
Total amount allocated to the school for the academic year 2014-15	<p><b>£48 600</b></p> <p>The Pupil Premium is allocated to children based on those eligible in the January Census of the preceding financial year( January 2014)</p>
How will the money be spent during the academic year 2014-15	<p>Raising attainment and achievement of students to at least expected progress through:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Additional teacher in Keystage 2, 5 mornings a week until July</li> <li>• Subsidising residential, school days out and fee paying after school clubs</li> <li>• Intervention groups/ activities to improve social emotional behaviours including happy/ sad club, cookery social skills</li> <li>• One to one tuition with specific focus on English skills</li> <li>• Intervention groups and activities in literacy or numeracy eg success at arithmetic, direct phonics</li> <li>• Behaviour support/ language acquisition</li> <li>• Summer holiday club</li> <li>• Specific equipment for children’s needs</li> <li>• Acquisition of reading materials specifically chosen by targeted children</li> <li>• HLTA role to include personalised support for each child in receipt of pupil premium</li> </ul>
