National Curriculum

As **Readers**, we will read, listen to, recite and discuss poems linked to our topic. We will explore the structure of poetry. We will read non-fiction texts linked to learning in other subjects and will ask and answer questions based on our reading.

As **writers**, we will read a variety of poems about Space and have a go at creating our own. We will be writing a letter of application to NASA. Based on our other learning we will plan and write texts of our own choice in Pendragon Writers Club.

As **Mathematicians**, we will be exploring numbers greater than 10, estimating and ordering, odd and even numbers and the operations; addition and subtraction.



As **Historians**, we will be learning about explorers and their life and experiences. The explorers we will research are Neil Armstrong, Tim Peake and Helen Sharman.

How was life different to that of our ancestors?

Why was the year 1969 important?



As **Scientists** we will be identifying and exploring different materials. We will then be deciding which materials we think are best for making levers and sliders in DT.



As **Musicians**, we will be exploring timbre, tempo and dynamics.

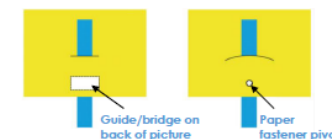
In **PSHCE**, we will be looking at Healthy and Safer lifestyles, in particular, Drug Education and the focus of this unit is safety around medicines and household substances.

In **PE**, we will be learning about games with a focus on throwing, running and catching. Within Gymnastics we are exploring Rock and Roll.

In **Computing**, we will be learning about Lego builders, following and creating algorithms and using the programme maze explores.



In Design and Technology, we will be looking at creating models using levers and sliders.

Maths: Key Instant Recall Facts (KIRFs) will be sent home to learn each half term.

Reading:

School reading scheme book – on a Monday your child will bring a book home to read with you. This book should be discussed and read at least three times throughout the week, it will be handed in every Friday. Ideally read daily for at least 10-15mins. Children should bring their reading record and book to school each day. Please make a comment and sign the reading record.

Once your child is reading Yellow Set 3 and above they will change their book on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday. It is still important for your child to read their book more than once in order to build fluency.

Children will also choose a book on a Friday from our Year 1 sharing library – snuggle up and enjoy together over the weekend.
