Learning Overview for week ending 12th September

Communication and Language/Literacy

- Talking to each other, listening to each other and waiting our turn to speak
- Singing nursery rhymes
- Sharing 'All about me' boxes
- Listening to the stories 'Colour Monster goes to school' and 'The Colour Monster'
- Talking about characters, settings and events (adventure time) through Drawing Club
- Learning emotion words including happy, delighted, sad, miserable, upset, angry, cross, frustrated, fear, scared, frightened, worried, calm and relaxed
- Recognising own name
- Learning the phonemes (sounds) s,a,t,p
- Hearing the initial phoneme (sound) in words using objects beginning with s,a,t,p
- Mark making using fingers, paintbrushes, pens and pencils
- Writing the graphemes (letters) s,a,t,p

Maths

- Counting on from 0 in ones to 5, 10, 15 then 20
- Counting back from 10 to 0
- Singing counting songs including '1 little, 2 little 3 little monsters', and '1,2,3,4,5 Once I caught a fish alive'
- Recognising numerals 0 to 4



Ideas for activities to do at home

- Encourage your child to tell you about The Colour Monster and all the different emotions he feels.
- Make faces to show the different emotions we might feel.
- Talk about the emotions you are all feeling and why.
- Find objects around the home that begin with s,a,t,p.
- Play I spy around the home, outside or when looking at a book to help identify initial phonemes.
- Please check the Foundation Stage page on the school website under the classes tab to check to are pronunciation/articulation of phonemes (sounds) correctly.
- Practise chant counting starting at zero. Walk from your house to the end of your garden or up and down the stairs, what number do you count to?
- Encourage your child to count as you lay the table, prepare a snack or play with toys.
- Ask your child to teach you the little monster counting song.

Dear parents/carers

In your child's book bag you will find a copy of the phonics cards we have learned in school this week. You can use these at home to help support your child's learning of phonics. Cut each strip and fold in half so the picture and letter side can be seen. Use as we would do in school, showing the picture side first, encouraging your child to say the word for the picture.

Then show the grapheme (written letter) on the reverse and ask your child to say only the phoneme (the single unit of sound). Repeat for all the flashcards provided.
