Learning Overview for week ending 10th October

Communication, Language and Literacy

- Consolidating phonemes s,a,t,p i,n,m,d,g,o,c,k
- Learning the phonemes ck, e, u, r, b, h, f, l
- Hearing the initial phoneme (sound) in words using objects ending with ck and beginning with ck, e,u,r,b,h,f,l
- Writing the graphemes (letters) ck, e,u,r,b,h,f,l
- Learning to read tricky words 'is' 'l' 'the'
- Practising oral blending through sound talking words then blending eg adult says c-a-t, child copies c-a-t and then blends cat.
- Blending to read cvc (consonant vowel consonant) words.
- Segment to spell cvc words.
- Reading and discussing books Peace at Last and The Little Red Hen. Talking about story characters, settings and events.

Ideas for activities to do at home

- Find objects around the home that begin with all the phonemes learned so far.
- Play I spy the grapheme (letter) ... at home, outside or when looking at a book.
- Play teachers using the phonics cards sent home. Please check the Foundation Stage page on the school website under the classes tab to check your pronunciation/articulation of phonemes (sounds) are correct.
- Practise chant counting starting at zero.
 Count as you walk up and down stairs.
- Recognise number 1, 2, 3 around your house or garden, e.g. there are three leaves, we need two more cups for the table, I can see one brick there and three bricks here.
- Go on a walk looking for signs of Autumn.
 Collect leaves, talk about these, order three smallest to biggest.
- Please encourage your child to put on their own coats and help them to learn how to turn sleeves the correct way.

Maths

- Counting on from 0 in ones to15, then 20.
- Counting back from 10 to 0.
- Subitising 1, 2, 3 using collections of objects and dot patterns on dice, dominoes and dot cards.
- Learning about different measures including size, capacity and mass.
- Using language to discuss and compare measure including big, small, bigger, smaller, heavy, light, heavier, lighter.
